With activities ranging from three-dimensional sculptures to figural collages, your family is sure to have an enriching hands-on art-making experience!

March 28	3-D Wood Sculpture	Working intuitively with wood chips and blocks, form your own non-objective design. Consider the large works in our contemporary galleries your inspiration for this project.
April 18	DIY Discoveries	Visit our contemporary skyway galleries to see work by artist Russell Crotty. Use your inspiration to make a recycled book sculpture based on his work.
April 25	Horned Dragons	Explore the whimsical and fantastical creatures created by self-taught Savannah artist Ulysses Davis, and then let your imagination take flight in studio! Create your own version of a horned dragon using self-hardening clay.
May 2	DIY Discoveries	How does artist David C. Driskell create such wildly vibrant works of art? Learn about printmaking today as we use cardboard to replicate Driskell's vivid and exciting work!
May 9	Colorful Block Prints	Block printing, or relief printing, is when an artist cuts away their image into wood or some other pliable material to print the image on paper. Let's experiment using this technique in the style of David C. Driskell's colorful prints on view.
May 16	DIY Discoveries	Learn about reverse glass painting like the work by Judy Jensen in the Stent wing. Then, make a shiny bottle cap pin based on her work.
May 23	Mono-print Portraits	Express yourself through color and bring your own wildness to paper! Learn about mono-printmaking today, by using tempera paint on plexi-glass and pulling several special works of art to share.
May 30	DIY Discoveries	Artist Vik Muniz is known for creating images made from unconventional materials, like his peanut butter and jelly Mona Lisa. Today in studio, think about wacky

materials and collage your own self-portrait.
